Task: You will be required to complete a detailed newspaper that reflects historical analysis based on what we researched and will learn this year in 10th grade Global. You are to create a Newspaper that has a **minimum of 8 different articles** on various topics or people from Global (see list below).

The Mark you earn will count as part of a test grade toward your first marking period report card. In addition, you will be given a THEMATIC ESSAY EXAM based on your newspapers in September. This is the second part of the grade (that will also appear on your first marking period report card).
